HISTORY OF BLUE

Blue is one of the three primary colours of pigments in painting and traditional colour theory. It lies between violet and green on the spectrum of visible light.



The notion of assigning accurate meanings to colours only became important a few hundred years ago. Until then, colours had different meanings depending on who was referring to them. Historians have noted an abundance of strange colour descriptions in Ancient Greece. In Homer's Odyssey, there are many descriptions about white and black colors, and yet red and yellow are scarcely mentioned. Similarly Blue, rarely was mentioned - the sea which Odysseus travels was described as "wine-dark."

It is said that blue is a favourite among people. Why? Potentially, it could be because of its dominance in nature – the sky is blue, and water is too. Yet, you won't find the blue in fruits and vegetables so easily. Blue has different meanings across cultures worldwide. The expression "blue blooded" is associated with aristocracy. In Belgium, counter to North America, blue is associated with baby girls, while pink is for the boys.

The colour blue has shown itself to be of major significance across artistic practices.

Egyptian Blue is understood to be the earliest blue pigment produced - dated 2,200 BC, it coincides with the construction of the Great Pyramids. French artist Yves Klein, felt his shade International Klein Blue, developed in the late 1950s, would be a revolutionary colour capable of transforming

the world.


Viewers can find many different shades of blue in Peter Triantos' works: ultramarine, Prussian blue, periwinkle & royal blue.
All of which make appearances alongside other bright hues.
The artist uses warm shades of blue as backgrounds, subjects, or accents to elicit vivid, bright, and energetic feelings.



Blue is a go-to colour for top interior designers for good reasons. HISTORY OF YELLOW

Yellow is the colour between orange and green on the spectrum of visible light. It is a primary colour in subtractive color systems, used in painting or colour printing.



'Splash of Color II' #123, 2018, acrylic on canvas, 48"x36" Alongside red, yellow is one of the oldest colors in art history. The oldest yellow pigment is yellow ochre, which was among the first color pigments. Yellow can be found in some of the oldest paintings in ancient Egypt and

ancient Rome.

Once featured in cave paintings, the use of yellow has been traced back as far as prehistoric times. Years later, Europeans in the Middle Ages managed to manufacture a yellow pigment called 'Lead Tin Yellow' which proved to be extremely

important of history in oil painting,

known as 'Yellow of the Old Masters'. Later on, modern chemistry led to the creation of many other yellows, including chrome yellow, cadmium yellow, lemon yellow, and cobalt yellow.

Studies show that the meaning of yellow can be warmth, cheerfulness, and increased mental activity. The color yellow helps activate the memory, encourage communication, enhance vision, build confidence, and stimulate the nervous system.

Peter Triantos uses yellow both gently, and in some of his paintings, it is cheerfully dominating as a bright, vivid background. Most commonly, yellow assists Peter Triantos to give the artwork more light, control, and balance.














